WELCOME. In the name of Jesus Christ, we welcome you to this Celebration of Worship. May we, each one, by the power of the Holy Spirit, experience a *close communion* with God and a *warm fellowship* with one another.

THANK YOU to our guest organist Dr. Wayne Earnest. Dr. Earnest earned his bachelor's degree at West Liberty State College, master's at the U. of Michigan, and doctorate from the University of Cincinnati. He was a college professor for several years and a church musician for well over 5 decades in various denominations. Additionally, he has played recitals in America and Europe and has published articles on church music. Retired in 2015, he continues playing as a substitute-/interim-organist, teaching, and composing. One of his favorite sayings is, "They don't care how much you know until they know how much you care."

MUSIC NOTES Pietro Mascagni's Intermezzo is a beautiful work that marks a transition between scenes in his opera Cavalleria Rusticana. While it is not religious per se, it nonetheless evokes an ethereal spirituality. In three short sections, Hal Hopson's arrangement of All Creatures of Our God and King reflects the meaning behind the words written by Saint Frances of Assissi (c.1181-1226). From a wealthy family, Saint Francis sold his belongings to travel and preach the Gospel, often under extenuating circumstances. While quite ill, lying in a mud hut, with vermin crawling over him, he was still able to write All Creatures of Our God and King.

Gordon Young's *Toccata on 'A Charge to Keep I Have*' reminds us to glorify God in our lives. As the old saying goes, "The way we live our lives is the only 'Bible' some people will ever read!" A huge responsibility and opportunity!


